

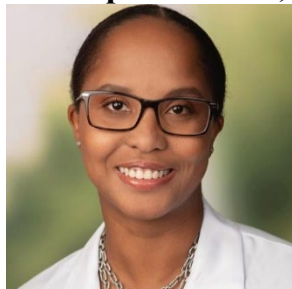

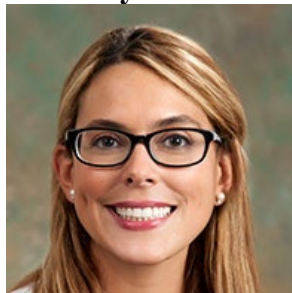

Dr. Jaelyn Nunziato, Obstetrician and Gynecologist, Carilion



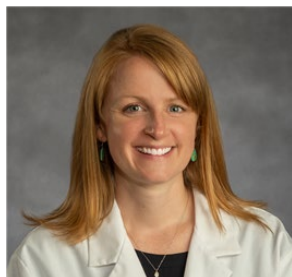

Kate Hulbert, Certified Nurse Midwife, VCU Health



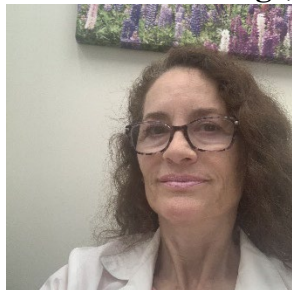
