Executive Directive 11

- Directs the State Health Commissioner and VDH, in consultation with SHHR, to develop a comprehensive maternal heath resource website
- Purpose of the website is to:
 - Provide mothers with essential resources in one accessible location, including information on public and private agencies providing resources
 - Centralize existing state resources and consolidate information spread across agencies
 - Enhance the directory of maternal health resources and ensure more comprehensive referrals for prenatal, pregnant, and postpartum care
 - Provide a more comprehensive list of services offered by public and private agencies for pregnancy, childbirth, and when a child is dependent
- A few specific resources to be included were named, including information on VDH programs (WIC, resource mothers, etc.), adoption from DSS, tax credits from DSS, and child care from VDOE

Breastfeeding



Breastfeeding can have many health benefits for your baby and its development. This section includes resources to learn more about breastfeeding and support with breastfeeding.

How can I get support from someone to help me breastfeed?

An IBCLC (International Board Certified Lactation Consultant) can provide expert knowledge, support, and care related to:

- Breastfeeding
- Pumping
- Lactation

Many IBCLCs work in hospitals and clinics. They may have their own private lactation consultant service. You can find an IBCLC using this directory.

If you are eligible for WIC Services, you can access breastfeeding support. This is done through a WIC Breastfeeding Peer Counselor. WIC Breastfeeding Peer Counselors are mothers who have also breastfeed their own babies. They are trained to give guidance to other moms on breastfeeding. For more information, visit the WIC breastfeeding page.

La Leche League is an organization which offers support groups for breastfeeding moms. They also provide breastfeeding guidance. Find your local La Leche League.

If you are a veteran, your local VA Clinic may be able to provide more information, support, or resources regarding breastfeeding. Find a VA Hospital near you.

How will my medications affect my breast milk?

What are my rights related to breastfeeding?

What if I produce more breast milk than I need (also called a surplus of milk)? +




Figure 1: Number and Rate of Pregnancy-Associated Deaths by Year in Virginia, 2019-2023




Figure 2: Rates of Manner of Pregnancy-Associated Deaths by Race, 2023
